

Nancy Blaney has worked on behalf of animals for more than 25 years and is currently a Senior Policy Advisor with the Animal Welfare Institute, which became the first advocate for animals on Capitol Hill in 1951. Dedicated to alleviating the suffering of animals caused by humans, AWI has been a leader in achieving the most significant federal animal protection laws and has extended its efforts to improving the enforcement of state and local cruelty laws and calling attention to the relationship between animal cruelty and interpersonal violence.

Nancy also serves as co-chair of the Animal Cruelty Advisory Council of the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys. She is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Maryland.
