

H.R. 2397 – The Fiscal Year 2014 Defense Appropriations Act

House Adopted Amendments

Walberg (R-MI) #1 – The amendment increases funding for the Special Purpose Marine Air Ground Task Force Crisis Response by \$10 million, offset by an \$11 million reduction to the Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Delaney (D-MD) #2 – The amendment increases funding for Fisher Houses, which provide free housing near military and VA medical centers for the families of wounded soldiers, by \$16 million, offset by a \$25 million reduction to the Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Grayson (D-FL) #4 – The amendment increases funding for the Defense Health Program by \$10 million, specifically to support Gulf War Illness funding. The amendment was offset by a cut of the same amount to the Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Israel (D-NY) #5 – The amendment increases the Defense Human Resources Activity account by \$10 million, offset by a reduction of the same amount to the Office of the Secretary of Defense. The intent of the amendment is to enhance mental health research, treatment, education, and outreach. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

En Bloc #1 – **The en bloc amendment was adopted on a voice vote.** Amendments included in En Bloc #1 are:

- **Kilmer (D-WA) #6** – The amendment makes a symbolic cut of \$1 million to the Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance, Defense Human Resources Activity account, and reinserts the funds in the same place, with the intent of encouraging a study on the Defense Manpower Data Center.
- **Esty (D-CT) #32** – The amendment adds \$10 million in funding to the Defense Health Program within the Overseas Contingency Operations account for suicide prevention awareness and outreach, offset by a reduction of \$38 million to the Afghan Security Forces Fund.
- **Sessions (R-TX) & Mike Thompson (D-CA) #76** – The amendment reduces the Office of the Secretary of Defense within the Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance account by \$10 million, and increases the Defense Health Program by the same amount to create a pilot program to assist servicemembers suffering from Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).
- **Bridenstine (R-OK), Joe Wilson (R-SC), & Bordallo (D-GU) #77** – The amendment adds \$10 million to the Army National Guard and Air National Guard Operations and Maintenance account for the National Guard State Partnership Program. This increase is

offset by an \$11 million cut to Defense Media Activity within the Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance account.

- **McKinley (R-WV), Napolitano (D-CA), McNerney (D-CA) & Lowenthal (D-CA) #78** – The amendment increases the Youth Challenge Programs by \$10 million, offset by a cut to the Office of the Secretary of Defense.
- **Bass (D-CA) #79** – The amendment makes a symbolic cut to the Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance account, and reinserts the funds in the same place with the intent to highlight the illicit poaching and trafficking of animal products that is often linked to terrorism and armed conflict.
- **Velázquez (D-NY) #80** – The amendment adds \$5 million in funding for the Defense Health Program within the Overseas Contingency Operations budget, to reduce military hazing and suicides. This increase is offset by a cut of \$19 million to the Afghan Security Forces Fund.
- **Grayson (D-FL) #81** – The amendment reduces Defense-wide Research, Development, Test and Evaluation by \$10 million, and increases funding for the Defense Health Program by \$10 million to bolster prostate cancer research efforts.
- **Esty (D-CT) #82** – The amendment increases Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance for Overseas Contingency Operations by \$5 million to strengthen support services such as the Yellow Ribbon Program for members of the National Guard and Reserve. This increase is offset by a cut of \$27.5 million to the Afghan Security Forces Fund.

Jackson Lee (D-TX) #9 – The amendment increases funding for the Defense Health Program by \$500,000, intended for PTSD research and treatment, offset by a cut of the same amount to the Army Environmental Restoration account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Jackson Lee (D-TX) #13 – The amendment reduces funding for Defense-wide Procurement by \$10 million, and transfers the same amount to the Defense Health Program to enhance breast cancer research. **The amendment was adopted on voice vote.**

En Bloc #2 – **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.** Amendments included in En Bloc #2 are:

- **Lowenthal (D-CA) #83** – The amendment increases funding by \$5 million for the STARBASE Youth Program for science and mathematics education. This increase is offset by a cut from the Office of the Secretary of Defense.
- **Griffin (R-AR) #86** – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to cancel or modify the avionics modernization program for C-130 aircraft.
- **Hunter (D-CA) #87** – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to plan for, consider, or carry out any action to remove any portion of the Mount Soledad Veterans

Memorial in San Diego, California. A cross has been on top of Mount Soledad since 1913.

- **Kline (R-MN) & Paulsen (R-MN) #88** – The amendment prohibits the Department of Defense (DOD) from using funds to grant an enlistment waiver to an individual convicted of an offense within offense code 433 (rape, sexual assault, or other sex crimes), as specified by the DOD enlistment waivers memorandum.
- **Nunes (R-CA), Costa (D-CA), Langevin (D-RI), Keating (D-MA), Cicilline (D-RI) & Valadao (R-CA) #89** – The amendment prohibits the Secretary of the Air Force from using funds within the bill for the reduction in force structure at Lajes Air Field in Azores, Portugal.
- **Runyan (R-NJ) # 90** – The amendment prohibits the use of funds to violate the FLY CRAF Act, which requires all DOD agencies to use Civil Reserve Air Fleet carriers if available. The amendment prohibits the use of funds for unapproved foreign carrier flights without proper authorization.
- **Bustos (D-IL) #91** – The amendment prohibits the Department of Defense from purchasing American flags not made in the United States.
- **Engel (D-NY) #92** – The amendment prohibits funding to lease or purchase light-duty vehicles that are not in compliance with the Presidential Memorandum on alternative fuel vehicles.
- **Grayson (D-FL) #93** – The amendment prohibits funding for contracts to companies convicted of various types of federal crimes, including fraud, embezzlement, etc., or that have more than \$3,000 in delinquent taxes within a three-year period surrounding the contract.
- **Grayson (D-FL) #94** – The amendment prohibits funding from being used to engage in torture or conspiracy to commit torture.
- **Grayson (D-FL) #95** – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to increase the number of flag or general officers above current levels.
- **LoBiondo (R-NJ) #96** – The amendment prohibits funding for DOD aviation demonstration teams to perform outside of the United States.

Heck (R-NV) #18 – The amendment provides \$15 million for the U.S. coproduction of the Iron Dome short-range rocket defense program. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Shea-Porter (D-NH) #21 – The amendment designates \$4.5 million to study the Therapeutic Service Dog Training Program as authorized by the Fiscal Year 2014 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Terry (R-NE) #24 – The amendment increases Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance account by \$1 billion to slow or halt civilian furloughs, offset by a cut of \$2.6 billion to the Afghanistan Security Forces Fund. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Walberg (R-MI) #27 – The amendment reduces the Afghanistan Infrastructure Fund by \$79 million, and transfers the savings to the Spending Reduction Account. The amendment was adopted on a vote of 283-139.

En Bloc #3 – **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.** Amendments included in En Bloc #3 are:

- **Cicilline (D-RI) #31** – The amendment increases funding for the Defense Health Program in the Overseas Contingency Operations budget by \$14 million – \$13 million intended for peer-reviewed TBI and psychological health research, and \$1 million intended for peer-reviewed alcohol and substance abuse disorders research. The increase is offset by a \$60 million cut to the Afghanistan Security Forces Fund.
- **Murphy (D-FL) #68** – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to maintain or improve facilities that DOD lists as being completely unused.
- **Broun (R-GA) #85** – The amendment prohibits DOD from using any funds to operate an unmanned aerial system in contravention of the Fourth Amendment of the Constitution.

Cohen (D-TN) #29 – The amendment cuts \$139 million from the Afghanistan Infrastructure Fund, and transfers the savings to the Spending Reduction Account. **The amendment was adopted on a vote 249-173.**

Coffman (R-CO) #30 – The amendment cuts \$553.8 million in funding for a contract with Rosoboronexport for 30 Mi-17 helicopters, and transfers the savings to the Spending Reduction Account. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 346-79.**

Fleming (R-LA) #35 – The amendment prevents funds from being used to appoint chaplains without an “endorsing agency” – which is a recognized religious institution. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 253-173.**

Rigell (R-VA) #36 – The amendment prohibits Afghanistan Infrastructure Fund from being used to commence new projects. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 332-94.**

Scalise (R-LA) #37 – The amendment prohibits the DOD from entering into any new contracts for the procurement or production of non-petroleum-based fuels for use as the same purpose or as a substitute for petroleum. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Flores (R-TX) #41 – The amendment prohibits funding to implement, administer, or enforce section 526 of the Energy Independence and Security Act, which prohibits federal agencies from procuring certain fuels unless the greenhouse gas emissions are less than conventional petroleum sources. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 237-189.**

Cole (R-OK) #42 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to furlough DOD federal employees paid from the Working Capital Fund, which is a revolving fund and does not receive direct congressional appropriations. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

DeLauro (D-CT) #44 – The amendment prohibits funding to train the Afghan Special Mission Wing to operate or maintain Rosoborone export helicopters. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 333-93.**

Kline (R-MN) #50 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to carry out DOD recruitment policies contrary to congressional intent in the Fiscal Year 2012 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), to ensure all students are given the same opportunities to enlist in the Armed Forces. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

LaMalfa (R-CA) #51 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to pay a fine assessed by the California Air Resources Board against a military installation. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 235-188.**

Lamborn (R-CO) #52 – The amendment prohibits the use of funds to conduct an environmental impact study on intercontinental ballistic missiles. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Lamborn (R-CO) #53 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to implement sequester-related furloughs of civilian DOD employees. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Meadows (R-NC) #54 – The amendment prohibits the use of fund for the salaries of recess appointees until the Senate has formally confirmed the appointee. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Mulvaney (R-SC) #55 – The amendment reduces funding for Overseas Contingency Operations by \$3.456 billion. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 215-206.**

Palazzo (R-MS) #57 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to plan for or carry out sequestration-related furloughs of Dual Status Military Technicians. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Rogers (R-AL) #58 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to reduce nuclear forces of the U.S. under the New START Treaty. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Turner (R-OH) #61 – The amendment prevents funds from being used to reduce strategic delivery systems in contravention of the Arms Control and Disarmament Act. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Walorski (R-IN) #62 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to transfer or release Guantanamo Bay detainees to Yemen. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 238-185.**

Bonamici (D-OR) #65 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to retire National Guard C-23 aircraft. The amendment also designates \$34 million within the Army Operations and Maintenance account to sustain and operate C-23s. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 264-154.**

Hanabusa (D-HI) #66 – The amendment prohibits funds to implement an enrollment fee for TRICARE for Life. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Kilmer (D-WA) #67 – The amendment prohibits funds to deny security clearances based on financial hardships caused by furloughs. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 277-142.**

Brooks (R-AL) #72 – The amendment prohibits funds to implement or execute a missile defense agreement with Russia, other than a treaty, or to provide Russia with information about United States ballistic missile defense systems. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Speier (D-CA) #74 – The amendment designates \$65 million in funding to identify individuals who were separated from the military on the grounds of a disorder subsequent to reporting a sexual assault, and correct their military records if needed. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Speier (D-CA) #75 – The amendment increases Army, Navy and Air Force Operations and Maintenance by \$10 million to train investigators to investigate sexual assault-related offenses. The increase is offset by a cut of the same amount to Defense-wide Operations and Maintenance. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Radel (R-FL) #97 – The amendment prohibits funds from being used for military action in Syria in contravention of the War Powers Resolution. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Massie (R-KY) #98 – The amendment prohibits funds for military or paramilitary operations in Egypt. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Pompeo (R-KS) #99 – The amendment prohibits funds to conduct an acquisition under section 702 of the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act (FISA) to target a U.S. person, or to acquire, store, or monitor the electronic communications of a U.S. person from a public service provider, under section 501 of FISA. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 409-12.**
