CTN00X10213, agency is Bureau of Indian Affairs, Programs are Agricultural Testing and Research Laboratory (NIIP Blocks 1-9), On-Farm Development (NIIP Block 9), Operation and Maintenance (NIIP Blocks 1-7).

5-year Mature Contract CY 2008 = \$5,047,891.00

5-year Mature Contract CY 2009 = \$5,958,332.00

5-year Mature Contract CY 2010 = \$6,071,097.00

CTN00X10214, agency is Bureau of Indian Affairs, Programs are On-Farm Development Subpart J Construction Contract (NIIP Rehabilitation of Blocks 4 & 5).

Subpart J Construction Contract CY 2009 to 2010 = \$7,300,000.00

CTN00X10215, agency is Bureau of Indian Affairs, Programs are Agricultural Testing and Research Laboratory, On-Farm Development, Operation and Maintenance (NIIP Blocks 1-7).

Cooperative Agreement 04-NA-40-2095, agency is Bureau of Reclamation, Program is Operation and Maintenance (NIIP Blocks 8, 9) in construction status. Contingent upon appropriations from Congress.

FY 2008 = \$862,000.00

FY 2009 = \$0.00, No funds received until 2010.

FY 2010 = \$879,550.36

FY 2011 = \$920,037.41, includes reimbursement for 2004-2009.

FY 2012 = \$700,000.00

Cooperative Agreement 05-NA-40-2290, agency is Bureau of Reclamation, Program is Minor Construction (NIIP in construction status & identified deficiencies). Contingent upon appropriations from Congress.

CY 2008 -- 2012 = Advance funds prior to 2008 have been utilized.

Note: Original Advances were received prior to 2008 and there have not been any receipt of funds through March 14, 2012. The O&M Department has been drawing against previous advances for invoicing and labor associated, advances included a \$177,451.25 carryover from 2004 and \$100,000 in 2006.

Cooperative Agreement 04-NA-40-2095, agency is Bureau of Reclamation, Program is Deficiency corrections (NIIP Blocks 1-6) identified by the Inspection Attorney General, 1989. Contingent upon appropriations from Congress.

FY 2008 -- 2012 = Advance funds prior to 2008 have not been utilized.

Note: Original Advances of \$200,000 in 2005 and \$500,000 in 2007.
