Social Problems of the Upper Mississippi River included the investigation of key problems facing the Upper Mississippi River, their causes, the major stakeholders, and possible solutions. Led numerous trips into the watershed and on the river, scheduled many stakeholders as guests, and twice my students organized and carried out removal of invasive plant species as the whole-class, semester service project.

Served on nine curricula, search, or advisory committees at Winona State University (WSU) Collaborated with other faculty and staff to create a Center for Mississippi River Studies, construct an interdisciplinary curriculum centered on the Mississippi River, and purchase of a 60-foot classroom vessel.

Oversaw 10,000 hours of community service completed by my students through internships and course-required service learning at WSU.

Faculty advisor to two student clubs for six years, third student club for five years at WSU.


