

THE 2021 TRUMP BUDGET

HURTS WORKING FAMILIES

President Trump's fiscal year 2021 budget proposes massive cuts and outright eliminations of discretionary programs that enhance the lives of students, parents, and working families.

Eliminates Afterschool Funding

Zeroes out funding for afterschool programs, making it harder to keep children safe and provide support for working families during non-school hours.

Reduces Support for Student Parents

Cuts funding for the Child Care Access Means Parents in School program by \$38 million, or 71 percent, forcing more parents to choose between their education and child care.

Limits Access to Preschool

Eliminates funding for Preschool Development Grants, preventing more children from accessing the early education they need to grow and thrive.

Attacks Postsecondary Education

Eliminates Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, making it more difficult for more students to pursue postsecondary education.

Jeopardizes the Economic and Social Well-Being of Families

Cuts funding for the Administration for Children and Families by \$4.2 billion, or 17 percent, reducing support for programs that foster economic independence and help families lead safe and healthy lives.
