Manager's Amendment offered by Ms. Pingree of Maine

In the bill:

On page 84, line 18, strike "such" and all that follows through "(SARA) and" on line 23, and insert the following: ", in the following order, amounts made available for fiscal year 2023 pursuant to section 613 of Public Law 117-58; to the extent necessary, such sums as are available in the Trust Fund on September 30, 2022, and not otherwise appropriated from the Trust Fund, as authorized by section 517(a) of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA); and to the extent necessary,"

In the report:

On page 11 on the 3rd line of Wild Horse and Burro Management change the sentence from " up to \$11,000,000 for research on reversible immunocontraceptive fertility control and its administration" to "\$11,000,000 for administration of and research on reversible immunocontraceptive fertility control".

On page 14 in the last paragraph strike "encourages" and replace with "directs".

On page 51, at the end of the paragraph entitled, "Blow Out Prevention Technology", insert "BSEE is urged to implement a performance standard for Blow Out Prevention Technology designed to sever and seal a well under all conditions to significantly decrease the potential for loss of well control and resulting oil spills."

On page 52, under the heading Remediation Projects insert "which can provide more lower-cost options to clean abandoned mine sites" after "projects,".

On page 72, after the last sentence under the header Lake Powell Recreation Advisory Committee insert "As part of this effort, the Committee directs the Park Service to provide a report not later than 60 days after enactment of this Act outlining infrastructure improvements necessary to maintain public access across Glen Canyon National Recreation Area and Rainbow Bridge National Monument as conditions change. The report should include estimated costs for each location, as well as funding commitments in fiscal year 2022 and 2023, to ensure continued lake access despite these changing conditions."
