Fiscal Year 2022 Appropriations Bill At-A-Glance



Provides **\$84.1 billion, an increase of more than 11 percent**, to create jobs, rebuild crumbling infrastructure, expand access to safe and affordable housing, and promote safety and resilience

Creates Good-Paying Jobs

- Creates tens of thousands of good-paying American jobs in construction, supportive services, and related industries by funding projects to reconstruct America's outdated infrastructure and open up opportunities for low-income and working Americans

Rebuilds Crumbling Infrastructure

- Rebuilds our crumbling runways, roads, and bridges with \$105.7 billion in budgetary resources for the Department of Transportation to invest in airports, highways, transit, passenger rail, and port systems
 - Invests more than \$250 million to reduce transportation emissions, increase resiliency, and address historical inequities
- Nearly doubles investments in passenger and freight rail and expands port infrastructure programs by nearly a third

Grows Opportunity Through Affordable Housing

- Provides more than 125,000 new housing vouchers targeted to individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness, survivors of domestic violence, and veterans; includes over 4,000 new units for seniors and persons with disabilities; and protects housing assistance for more than 4.8 million individuals and families
- Includes over \$11.3 billion in funding to construct new and repair old affordable housing and improve critical health, safety, and maintenance of public and low-income housing
- Directs \$1.85 billion in funding to states and local governments through the HOME Investment Partnerships Program, and doubles the number of distressed neighborhoods that could be revitalized through the Choice Neighborhoods Initiative program
- Reduces our carbon footprint by investing more than \$205 million across the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to improve energy and water efficiency and increase resiliency of public and low-income housing

Promotes Safety

- Promotes safe transportation and housing with a skilled and growing workforce to conduct inspections, mitigate hazards, and study emerging threats and innovative solutions to strengthen cybersecurity
- Increases the safety and long-term viability of roads and highways, expands bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure, supports Federal auto safety programs, and invests in the transit state of good repair, consistent with the INVEST in America Act
- Includes \$460 million for the Office of Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes to improve living conditions for low-income families by investing in lead paint and radon testing, including \$60 million to conduct lead inspections in Section 8 voucher units to improve the health and condition of housing where nearly 229,000 children reside
