Acting Director Fairweather,

As Congress considers another COVID-19 relief package, we write to respectfully request updated information on all discretionary funds previously appropriated to address COVID-19 in the Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2020 (P.L. 116-123), Families First Coronavirus Response Act (P.L. 116-127), CARES Act (P.L. 116-136), Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act (P.L. 116-139), and Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (P.L. 116-260).

The ongoing pandemic has been devastating for millions of Americans. Congress and the previous administration enacted five separate, bipartisan bills to deliver trillions of dollars in relief. Most recently, the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021– enacted only weeks ago – provided over \$900 billion in discretionary and mandatory COVID-19 relief funding.

We are committed to continuing to work in a bipartisan manner to deliver additional, targeted relief for the American people as needed. To help us better understand how these funds are being used on the frontlines and to ensure that any future funding addresses actual gaps and resource needs, we ask you to please provide updated information on all discretionary funding for COVID-19 relief across the five bills.

We appreciate the preliminary data that some individual departments and agencies already have provided to the House Appropriations Committee. However, because agencies report information differently and because obligations and expenditures change daily, we still require complete, consistent, and current information.

By no later than February 9, 2021, we request a comprehensive and consistent report detailing the obligated, unobligated, and expended balances by account for the roughly \$700 billion in discretionary COVID-19 relief funds appropriated in fiscal years 2020 and 2021, including:

- 1. \$7.8 billion appropriated in the Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2020 (P.L. 116-123);
- 2. \$2.5 billion appropriated in the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (P.L. 116-127);
- 3. \$329.7 billion appropriated in the CARES Act (P.L. 116-136);
- 4. \$162.1 billion appropriated in the Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act (P.L. 116-139); and
- 5. \$190.8 billion appropriated in the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (P.L. 116-260). This includes \$184.3 billion in Division M (COVID-19 discretionary supplemental) and \$6.5 billion of emergency-designated discretionary funding for COVID-19 relief in Divisions A-L.

We appreciate your attention and look forward to your response.
