**AMENDMENT TO TRANSPORTATION-HUD APPROPRIATIONS BILL
OFFERED BY MR. WOMACK OF ARKANSAS**

In the bill:

On page 36, line 12, strike “\$270,860,000” and insert “\$269,860,000”.

On page 36, line 23, strike “\$240,860,000” and insert “\$239,860,000”.

On page 46, line 22, strike “\$1,135,161,350” and insert “\$1,139,161,350”.

On page 47, line 5, strike “\$235,161,350” and insert “\$239,161,350”.

On page 48, line 3, strike “\$725,161,350” and insert “\$729,161,350”.

On page 145, line 13, strike “\$5,852,707,616” and insert “\$5,849,707,616”.

On page 229, after line 13, insert:

“Sec. 424. None of the funds made available by this Act may be used to provide Federal funds to a local jurisdiction that refuses to comply with a request from the Department of Homeland Security to provide advance notice of the scheduled release date and time for a particular illegal alien in local custody.”

On page 229, on line 15, strike “424” and insert “425”.

And modify account levels and language in the report accordingly.

In the report:

On page 8, after the paragraph with the header “*Distressed coal communities*”, insert the following:

“*Drug testing.*—The Committee is aware of ongoing changes to Federal and State laws governing the legal status and scheduling of certain controlled substances. The Committee emphasizes that such changes should not be construed to alter existing Federal drug testing requirements applicable to Federal employees and individuals serving in safety-sensitive positions. The Committee directs DOT to continue requiring testing for marijuana, cocaine, opioids, amphetamines, phencyclidine (PCP), and any additional controlled substances included on the Federal drug testing panel for individuals occupying safety-sensitive positions regulated by the Federal Aviation Administration, Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, Federal Railroad Administration, Federal Transit Administration, and Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration, regardless of any future changes to the legal status or scheduling of such substances under Federal law.”

On page 8, before the paragraph with the header “*Suicide prevention infrastructure*”, insert the following:

“*Public safety of Port Authority of New York and New Jersey.*—The Committee notes the workforce demands of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey Police Department is extensive given the volume of Port Authority-operated airports, bridges, tunnels, ports, and other regionally significant transportation assets. The Committee encourages the Department to engage with the Port Authority regarding opportunities to expand hiring eligibility of nearby counties, like Suffolk, and any other steps the Department can take, consistent with existing law, to encourage recipients of Federal transportation assistance to maintain transparent, job-related, and appropriately tailored public safety recruitment criteria.”
