FY 2018 FUNDING BILL

Provides \$1.3T in discretionary funding for all 12 annual Appropriations bills, including \$78.1B in funding for the Global War on Terror/Overseas Contingency Operations, adhering to budget caps set by the recently enacted Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018

MAKES THE LARGEST INVESTMENT IN ARMED FORCES IN 15 YEARS

- Provides \$654.6B for the Department of Defense \$589.5B in discretionary funding and \$65.2B in Global War on Terror/Overseas Contingency Operations funding for a total FY18 increase of \$61.1B above FY17
 - This is the the biggest year-to-year increase in defense funding since the beginning of the War on Terror
- Rebuilds our military after years of damage and neglect done under the previous Administration fulfilling requests by Secretary Mattis and our military leaders
- Gives our brave warfighters the resources they need not only to win the fight but return home safely
- Fully funds a 2.4% pay raise for our troops

DIRECTS DOMESTIC FUNDING TO CRITICAL PRIORITIES

- Secures our homeland targets \$1.571B for physical barriers and associated technology along the Southwest border (providing for 90+ miles of border wall system, beyond the Administration's request for 74 miles in FY18), puts more "boots on the ground," and increases detention beds
- **Rebuilds America's aging infrastructure** a top priority of the President by investing an additional **\$21.2B** for infrastructure projects across the country, including transportation, energy and water, and cyber
- Provides the largest investment to date to combat the opioid crisis that President Trump declared as a national public health emergency, including robust funding for treatment, prevention, and law enforcement programs that stop the spread of these dangerous drugs and help families and communities get the assistance they need
- Helps keep our kids and schools safe by targeting more than \$2.3B in new funding to effective mental health, training, and school safety efforts programs at the Departments of Justice, Education, and Health and Human Services
- Targets funding increases toward conservative priorities that will protect and support all Americans, holds down spending for agencies and programs that have been wasteful, ineffective, or controversial, and makes the most of every tax dollar by strengthening oversight
- Maintains all provisions to preserve Second Amendment rights government-wide
- Preserves the sanctity of life, maintaining existing pro-life provisions and protecting the President's Mexico City policy
