Brad J. Bushman is a professor of communication and psychology at The Ohio State University, and a professor of communication science at the VU University, Amsterdam. He holds the Margaret Hall and Robert Randal Rinehart Chair of Mass Communication. For nearly 30 years he has studied the causes and consequences of human aggression. He has published over 130 peer-reviewed journal articles. His research has challenged several myths (e.g., violent media have a trivial effect on aggression, venting anger reduces aggression, violent people suffer from low self-esteem, violence and sex on TV sell products, warning labels reduce audience size). His research has been published in the top scientific journals (e.g., Science, Nature), and has been featured on television (e.g., ABC News 20/20, CBS Evening News, Discovery Channel, PBS NewsHour), on radio (BBC, NPR, CBC) in magazines (e.g., Scientific American, Newsweek, Time, Health), and in newspapers (e.g., New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Washington Post, USA Today).
