H.R. 4923 – The FY 2015 Energy and Water Appropriations Bill

House Adopted Amendments

Walorski (R-IN) – The amendment increases funding for the Army Corps of Engineers Construction account by \$500,000, offset by a reduction in the Department of Energy (DOE) Departmental Administration account. The intent of the amendment is to support small flood control projects. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Murphy (D-FL) – The amendment increases funding for the Army Corps of Engineers Construction account by \$1 million, offset by a reduction to the Army Corps Expenses account. The intent of the amendment is to support reducing the construction backlog. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Cassidy (R-LA) – The amendment increases funding for the Army Corps of Engineers Construction account, offset by a reduction in the DOE Departmental Administration account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Hahn (D-CA) – The amendment increases funding for the Army Corps of Engineers Operation and Maintenance account by \$57.6 million, offset by a reduction of \$73.3 million in DOE's Nuclear Energy account. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 281-137.**

Cassidy (R-LA) – The amendment increases funding for the Army Corps of Engineers Operation and Maintenance account by \$1 million, offset by a reduction in the Departmental Administration account at DOE. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Lankford (R-OK) – The amendment allows the expenditure of necessary funds to carry out the study authorized in Sec. 6002 of the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA) of 2014. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Ruiz (D-CA) – The amendment cuts, then adds back, \$1 million to the Bureau of Reclamation Water and Related Resources account. The intent of the amendment is to support funding for environmental restoration projects. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Gardner (R-CO) – The amendment cuts, then adds back, \$3 million to the Bureau of Reclamation Water and Related Resources account. The intent of the amendment is to support funding for water conservation and delivery projects. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Noem (R-SD) – The amendment increases funding for the Bureau of Reclamation Water and Related Resources account by \$10 million, offset by a \$7 million reduction in the DOE Energy

Efficiency and Renewable Energy (EERE) account, and a \$6 million reduction in the DOE Departmental Administration account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Bonamici (D-OR) – The amendment increases funding for the EERE account by \$9 million, offset by a cut to the Departmental Administration account at DOE. The intent of the amendment is to support funding for the water power program. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 221-199.**

Kaptur (D-OH) – The amendment increases DOE’s Departmental Administration account by \$500,000, offset by a cut to the Energy Information Administration account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Reed (R-NY) – The amendment increases the Non-Defense Environmental Cleanup account by \$4 million, offset by a cut to DOE’s Departmental Administration account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Foster (D-IL) – The amendment cuts, then adds back, \$300,000 to the DOE Office of Science account. The intent of the amendment is to support the National Undergraduate Fellowship Program. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Schiff (D-CA) – The amendment increases funding for the Advanced Research Projects Agency – Energy (ARPA-E) by \$20 million, offset by a cut to DOE’s Departmental Administration account. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 216-205.**

Kaptur (D-OH) – The amendment cuts, then adds back, \$1 million to the DOE Departmental Administration account. The intent of the amendment is to support DOE’s Environmental Justice program. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Lummis (R-WY) – The amendment prohibits funding to be used in contravention of certain sections of the USEC Privatization Act. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

DeLauro (D-CT) – The amendment prohibits funds from being used to award contracts to corporations incorporated or chartered in Bermuda or the Cayman Islands that were previously incorporated in the United States. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 221-200.**

Speier (D-CA) – The amendment prohibits funding to be used in contravention of the Whistleblower Protection Act. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Lankford (R-OK) – The amendment prohibits funding to prepare, propose, or promulgate any regulation or guidance related to “social cost of carbon” executive orders. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 227-191.**

Cassidy (R-LA) – The amendment prohibits funding to apply a report titled “Life Cycle Greenhouse Gas Perspective on Exporting Liquefied Natural Gas from the United States” in certain public interest determinations. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 232-187.**

Engel (D-NY) – The amendment prohibits funding to lease or purchase new light-duty vehicles for any executive fleet, except in accordance with a Presidential Memorandum on Federal Fleet Performance. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Burgess (R-TX) – The amendment prohibits funding to implement or enforce the light bulb standards in the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 226-193.**

Ellison (D-MN) – The amendment prohibits funding for any contractor who has been found to have violated certain wage requirements under the Fair Labor Standards Act. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Grayson (D-FL) – The amendment prohibits funding to award a contract to a company currently indicted or previously convicted of certain crimes, or that has outstanding delinquent taxes of more than \$3000 within a three-year period of the contract. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

LaMalfa (R-CA) – The amendment prohibits funding to regulate certain agricultural activities exempted from regulation under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 239-182.**

Luetkemeyer (R-MO) – The amendment prohibits funding for the Missouri River Authorized Purposes Study. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Luetkemeyer (R-MO) – The amendment prohibits funding for an environmental study under the Missouri River Fish and Wildlife Recovery Program. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Stockman (R-TX) – The amendment prohibits funding for DOE to block off-shore drilling permits. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 218-204.**

Sean Patrick Maloney (D-NY) – The amendment prohibits funding to implement, administer, or enforce the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) order entitled "Order Accepting Proposed Tariff Revisions and Establishing a Technical Conference." **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Scalise (R-LA) – The amendment prohibits funding for the Army Corps of Engineers in Louisiana to implement or enforce the "Modified Charleston Method" – a wetlands calculation process. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Yoho (R-FL) – The amendment prohibits funding for the Sustainable Cities program in China and India, funded from the EERE account. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Fleming (R-LA) – The amendment prohibits funding to pay the salary of any officer or employee to carry out section 301 of the Hoover Power Plant Act of 1984, as amended by the

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Walberg (R-MI) – The amendment prohibits funding for a national media campaign on green technologies. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

McKinley (R-WV) – The amendment prohibits funding for the Administration's climate change agenda, which includes the National Climate Assessment, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change report, the UN's Agenda 21, and the Social Cost of Carbon. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 229-188.**

McKinley (R-WV) – The amendment prohibits funding to transform, close, or consolidate the National Energy Technology Laboratory (NETL). **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Weber (R-TX) – The amendment prohibits funding for the Cape Wind Project on the Outer Continental Shelf off Nantucket Sound. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Byrne (R-AL) – The amendment prohibits funding to implement, administer, or enforce Executive Order No. 13547, the National Ocean Policy. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Gosar (R-AZ) – The amendment prohibits funding for DOE's Climate Model Development and Validation program. **The amendment was adopted on a vote of 226-194.**

Gosar (R-AZ) – The amendment prohibits funding for Bureau of Reclamation grants for high-efficiency or indoor water-efficient toilets. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

Kelly (R-PA) – The amendment prohibits funding from being used in contravention of certain sections of WRRDA in regards to the Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund as it relates to the Great Lakes. **The amendment was adopted on a voice vote.**

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
